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The Languages of Kaendor

Most folk on the planet of Kaendor speak their native racial tongue as well as Common Kaendoran. Nearly all cultures raise their children to speak both languages. Many are fluent in other languages as well, but only the spellcasters, the scholars, the LoreMasters and a few select others are well versed in Ancient Kaendoran - the reunik language of the old world before the Great KaendFire devastated it.

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The Core Languages

There are twelve core languages on Kaendor, one for each of the separate racial groups. Following are the twelve core language groups on Kaendor.

- ▶ Common Kaendoran – All Humans
- ▶ Dwárvish – All Dwarves
- ▶ Elvish – All Elves
- ▶ Hafýn – All Hafýn (Halflings)
- ▶ Nomish – All Noms (Gnomes)
- ▶ Aevraikeu – All Avian Humanoids (Bird Folk)
- ▶ Aneubýn – All Canine Humanoids (Dog Folk)
- ▶ Brursárian – All Ursa Humanoids (Bear Folk)
- ▶ Kobronian – All Rodentia Humanoids (Rat Folk)
- ▶ Lozáran – All Reptilian Humanoids (Lizard Folk)
- ▶ Mýntáran – All Mýntár Humanoids (Minotaurs)
- ▶ Wairýn – All Feline Humanoids (Cat Folk)

Dialects. Each sub-race within each racial group has it's own dialect. If you know one Elvish dialect, you have a strong chance of understanding verbal and written instances of any other Elvish Dialect. The same is true for each of the major racial groups listed below. Some races, such as the anthropomorphic humanoid races do not have sub-races but, may or may not have various dialects based on geographical area (left to GameMaster discretion). An Adventurer's chance to know another dialect is in the LANGUAGES section of the Adventurer Record Sheet.

Knowing Other Languages. In addition, because all languages on Kaendor have their root in the nearly lost Ancient Kaendoran language of the Old Worlde, every Adventurer has a moderate chance to understand the general meaning or concept of verbal or written instances of languages which are not in their language group. For example, if your Adventurer speaks the Wood Elf dialect, he/she has a strong chance to understand any other Elvish dialect and a moderate chance to understand the Dwárvish or any other dialect in any of the remaining eleven language groups. An Adventurer's chance to know another core language is in the LANGUAGES section of the Adventurer Record Sheet.

An Ancient Tome in an Ancient Tomb

It just so happens that Worlde of Legends™ has been able to procure an ancient Kaendoran tome that can be no other than the first dictionary of Kaendor. It was found deep underground, in a hidden vault in the tomb of the renowned Ancient Kaendoran scholar, Lotaer Voránodýn.

Master Lotaer is best known for his documentation of the establishment of the Council of Twelve and his work in making the University of Kaendor a viable and successful organization. We now know he was instrumental in the first translation of the Ancient Kaendoran reuns into the Common Kaendoran language of today.

The ancient tome, whose cracked leather binding was inscribed in gold, was titled To Womá do á Maelán – Á Lorsh do Eul Womá Kovrá deh to Maelán'do'Kaendor (The Words of a Worlde – A List of All Words Known to the Worlde of Kaendor). There was another inscription beneath it, but the leather was cracked to badly to decipher it.

The Lore Keepers of Gaeldá'Sáda, who have spent many long hours studying the timeworn leather cover, believe it to be a date, a date that is still unknown to this day. Based on the location in which it was found, it is estimated to be nearly 400 years old.

The venerable tome was covered in layers of dust and trapped with spells. It took every ounce of wit and intelligence and majikal skill which could be mustered to be able to open it safely. It was not an easy task; but a few shocked fingers and singed hairs later (and some temporary blindness and deafness), it was done. The Kaendoran Lexicon was ours!

The old tome was very fragile, so we immediately teleported it to the Majik Research Center in the Mýstik Isle and assigned a team to begin generating a copy of it. Many parts of the old parchment pages were faded or torn and were difficult to read. It was truly a trying a tedious task that required great amounts of patience, perseverance, and dedication. The team was able to decipher it with much assessment and deliberation, and a successful copy was made.

Now, as the brittle pages of the original book begin to crumble at the edges, we proudly present unto you the spoils of our treasured find and ever so diligent work. We continue to diligently work at copying every bit of content found in that ancient tome and will periodically provide updates to the lexicon and related resources.

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Ancient Kaendoran Word Spelling Guide

The Ancient Kaendoran language is built completely on letter sounds. Words are spelled EXACTLY how they sound with very few exceptions. This guide provides a list of American English sounds and their Ancient Kaendoran written vowels, diphthongs, and consonants. This will help you spell Adventurer names (or your IRL name if you wish) in the Kaendoran spelling. Determine exactly how a word sounds in Kaendoran, then use this guide to get the appropriate Kaendoran spelling. **Please note that Kaendoran does not utilize silent letters, including unvoiced double-letters.** This guide will not help you translate Ancient Kaendoran into American English or vice versa.

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Ancient Kaendoran Word-Building Guide

The first texts in the Ancient Kaendoran lexicon are not so much a lexicon, but more an accounting of the early history of the Worlde. In those writings, the following word rules were not necessarily used, therefore, it is likely that some of the words in known lexicon also do not follow these rules. However, at the time when Ancient Kaendoran scholar, Lotaer Voránodýn took over the project shortly after the more modern version of the Kaendoran language (aka common language) became used on a widespread basis, he not only continued to document history, but also created a list of words thus providing a translation guide. He found that the following rules were true for all words that were logged following the formation of the College of Language created by the Lore Masters in the le'Kel (Sky Elf) city, Gaelda'Sáda. It is strongly recommended that scholars of the current day, follow Master Lotaer's rules when deciphering ancient texts from the ancient reunik glyphs to the new alphabet.
